

Lua Pele



The island of Hawai'i was made by five lua pele (volcanoes): Mauna Kea, Mauna Loa, Kohala, Hualalai, and Kīlauea. Teach keiki about the lua pele (volcanoes) that created the island by creating a paper mache lua pele (volcano). Use various art materials and recycled materials to make different sized volcanoes. Drawing, cutting, and pasting develop keiki's fine motor skills by strengthening their hand and finger muscles as they gain control with various tools.



Measure 5 Tbs of water into a bowl



Add 2 Tbs of glue into the same bowl



Mix together



Place a plastic cup upside down on a plate and dip cut, shredded paper into the bowl.



Cover the entire cup with paper.



Decorate

Materials: glue, water, tablespoon, recycled cup or bottle, various art materials, newspaper, tissue paper, gloves (optional)

Learning Objectives

Literacy: Discuss with keiki what to do when a volcano erupts in your local area.

Creative Arts: Keiki will create representations of real volcanoes and concepts in artwork.

Fine Motor Development: Keiki strengthen their pincer grasp as they tear, rip, cut and dip the recycled paper into the water to cover their volcano.
